THE LAKESHORE HS CHOIRS

Women's Chorus: A non-auditioned choir comprised of women with or without past singing experience designed to fit the needs and desires of students who are interested in vocal music and demonstrate an attitude toward singing with choral excellence. Daily rehearsals will include the study of singing technique, sight-singing, music theory, and performance habits. Students will be expected to participate in 4 concerts throughout the year, as well as MSVMA District and State Festivals. Additional training and performing opportunities will be available to students through activities sponsored by the Michigan Vocal Music Association and/or the American Choral Directors Association.

Men's Chorus: A non-auditioned choir comprised of men with or without past singing experience designed to fit the needs and desires of students who are interested in vocal music and demonstrate an attitude toward singing with choral excellence. Daily rehearsals will include the study of singing technique, sight-singing, music theory, and performance habits. Students will be expected to participate in 4 concerts throughout the year, as well as MSVMA District and State Festivals. Additional training and performing opportunities will be available to students through activities sponsored by the Michigan Vocal Music Association and/or the American Choral Directors Association.

Bella Voce: An auditioned choir comprised of freshman through senior women with past singing experience, a demonstrated ability to sight sing, and an attitude toward singing with choral excellence. In addition to studying and performing a broad range of vocal music styles, this ensemble will explore more in depth techniques for beautiful singing, sight-singing, music theory, and performance practices. Students will be expected to participate in 4 concerts throughout the year, as well as MSVMA District and State Festivals, vocal workshops, and community events. This ensemble maintains a very active co-curricular rehearsal and performance schedule. Additional training and performing opportunities will be available to students through activities sponsored by the Michigan Vocal Music Association and/or the American Choral Directors Association
Prerequisite: Audition and Director Approval

Chorale: An auditioned choir comprised of sophomore through senior men and women with past singing experience, a demonstrated ability to sight-sing, and an attitude toward singing with choral excellence. In addition to performing 4-part choral literature, this ensemble will explore more in-depth techniques for beautiful singing, sight-singing, music theory, and performance practices. Students will be expected to participate in 4 concerts throughout the year, as well as MSVMA District and State Festivals, vocal workshops, and community events. This ensemble maintains a very active co-curricular rehearsal and performance schedule. Additional training and performing opportunities will be available to students through activities sponsored by the Michigan Vocal Music Association and the American Choral Directors Association.
Prerequisite: Audition and Director Approval

POLICIES

ATTENDANCE – *Every student is required to be at every scheduled rehearsal and performance.* To be successful individually, and as a group, consistent attendance, punctuality, and participation are necessary. Choir students are required to be at every rehearsal (regular or extra scheduled) and performance; attendance record is a portion of a student’s grade. Choir is a team effort, and we rely on those around us. When a student is absent, unlike many other classes, the entire chorus of students must adjust and make changes. Individual attendance affects not only the individual, but also the entire group.

Any absence must be handled through parental contact to Ms. Rohwer directly. Choir schedules are given early in the year and updates made as soon as possible. Students and families are asked to plan around concerts and after school rehearsals. Students with schedule conflicts in sports and other school organizations need to make the director/coach of both events aware of the conflict as soon as possible so that an agreeable plan can be reached in advance. If you have an emergency on a concert night, please leave a message at 269-428-1402, ext 2533.

The Lakeshore Performing Arts Policy for Middle and High School choirs and bands applies. According to this policy, there are two kinds of absences:

excused absences and unexcused absences

Excused absences are *family emergencies, personal illness, and those given at the discretion of the director* when notified in **ADVANCE** by the parent/guardian. A phone call or letter received prior to the start of the event is required. Please be advised that work and vacation conflicts are not considered an excused absence. An unexcused absence results in a complete loss of points for the given performance. If the absence is excused, students are expected to make up the points through “Musical Community Service” before the end of the marking period. Make-up service hours are available only when the absence is properly excused- unexcused absences are automatic zeros. Dress Rehearsals- 3 hours of Music Community Service; Concerts, Festivals, etc – 5 hours of Music Community Service.

GRADING – Grades will be determined in the following areas:

Musicianship Participation (40%)

Students will receive a daily participation grade of 3 points (15 points/week) based on preparedness, effort, and attitude. Students earn daily points by meeting the daily rehearsal expectations. Daily rehearsal expectations include:

*Preparedness: Arrives on time, has choir folder, music and pencil, demonstrates knowledge of music. Students are expected to work on music outside of classtime.

*Effort: Demonstrates proper posture without being reminded, focuses on proper breathing technique and vocal production, makes eye contact with director, stays on task, complies with rehearsal procedure, and engages in classroom activities.

*Attitude: Exudes a positive personal attitude, exhibits self-motivation, refrains from disruptive behavior, assist teammates, and strives to have fun!

Performances and Events (40%)

Performances are the culmination of our rehearsals, and therefore an important demonstration and assessment of what we learn in class. Attendance at all performances and events on the schedule identified as required are mandatory, and unexcused absences result in a complete loss of points for the given performance (see Attendance Policy). *Excused absences* can be made up with music community service or an assignment. It is the student's responsibility to request the music community service assignment from the teacher, and it must be completed by the end of the marking period.

Classwork/Quizzes (20%)

In choir, we not only need to learn to how to sing and appreciate choral music, but also how to read, interpret, and analyze the music we perform. The theory concepts we cover are crucial to the musical growth of the individual and ensemble. Written work or online exercises will be assigned throughout each marking period and must be turned in on the designated due date at the beginning of class. At various times, students will be asked to demonstrate their knowledge through performance and written assessments that include but are not limited to:

- *Singing/memorization test
- *Sight reading test
- *Written theory quiz

An exam will be given at the end of each semester that may include a written theory section and a performance section. Semester grades are calculated by averaging both marking period grades with the semester exam grade – 40%, 40%, 20%

CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS

1. Choir students will be positive, helpful, musical, hardworking, and respectful.
2. Choir students will have a pencil, folder, and music at all times. All other belongings (i.e. backpacks, purses, hats, cell phones) are not to be in the rehearsal space.
3. Choir students will be in their seats with their materials on time – they will also arrive to performances and be checked in on time per the “call time.”
4. Choir students will not chew gum or have food and drink in the classroom – with the exception of water.
5. Choir students will affirm one another.

CODE OF CONDUCT

The Lakeshore High School Student Code of Conduct for Athletics and the Fine Arts will apply to all students. Additionally, the following should be noted:

1. Bullying, harassment, speaking negatively to or about another student will not be tolerated.
 - Every student is expected to treat each other with respect during and outside of the school day.
 - Every student is expected to encourage each other’s learning. Gossip, rumors, exclusion, or negative facial expressions towards another student in the classroom is not acceptable and will not be tolerated.
2. No tolerance for drugs and alcohol.
 - Use of drugs or alcohol during or outside the school day is unacceptable, and if discovered by the director, will be reported immediately. LHS Code of Conduct will apply.

These expectations are put in place for the success of our ensembles. The consequences for disregarding any of the preceding expectations and/or code of conduct can include: deductions from the Participation Grade, conference with director, parental calls, loss of leadership position, removal from an ensemble, or disciplinary referrals.

EXTRA CREDIT – Extra credit opportunities for choir include:

- Donating Kleenex or hand-sanitizer.
- Concert Review (of a concert you attend). Turn in the program with comments.
- Attending Choir Parent Organization meetings (with your parent).

- Assignments given at the discretion of the director.

MUSIC AND FOLDERS – Lakeshore High School will provide a folder and music for each student. That music and folder are solely the responsibility of the student. Music and folder should be kept in the same condition as when received. Should the music or folder become damaged or lost, students will be required to pay for their replacement (just as a damaged or lost textbook). Each piece of music = \$2.00 Choir Folder = \$15.00

UNIFORMS –. Uniforms make us look professional and provide a sense of unity as an ensemble. Singers must have all uniform parts clean and presentable at all times. If you appear with wrinkled, soiled, or an incomplete uniform, you may not be able to perform and your grade will be affected.

Ladies: A dress from Lakeshore Schools specific to the student’s ensemble. All ladies must provide their own skin toned hosiery and closed toe, small heeled or flat black dress shoes.

Men: Tuxedo jacket, white tuxedo shirt, pants, and bow tie from Lakeshore Schools specific to the student’s ensemble. Men must provide black dress socks and shoes.

All Choir Members:

Hair: Hair must be UP and out of your face. Use only brown or black hair bands or barrettes. No headbands will be allowed.

Jewelry: No flashy jewelry. Only stud earrings and no necklaces please, unless provide by Lakeshore Choirs.

A \$10.00 dry cleaning fee is requested upon distribution of the uniforms. The fee for a damaged or lost uniform is \$100.

A word about paying for things...

Students and their families who may have difficulty paying for items such as accessories or field trips will never be excluded from participating. Your needs will always remain confidential. Please contact Ms. Rohwer if you have a need.

AWARDS – All awards are given at the discretion of the director. Upon earning a successful GPA (3.0 or higher) in choir, students are awarded the following:

First Year Recognition (certificate): Shows effort and achievement, is a member for one full year.

Second Year Letter and Pin: Maintains a 3.0 in choir, is a member for two years, participates in at least one extra curricular choral activity.*

Third and Fourth Year Awards: After earning the initial letter and pin, an additional pin is awarded each year requirements are fulfilled.

Outstanding Member Award: Awarded to the two most outstanding individuals in each ensemble based on musicianship, leadership qualities, attitude, dedication to vocal music, and service to ensemble. Participation in extra curricular choral activities is favorable.*

Director's Award: Awarded to two-three individuals who demonstrate exceptional leadership qualities and service to the program. Also based on musicianship and attitude.

The National School Choral Award: The highest honor for high school choral performers. Recognizes the dedication and musical achievement of the top male and female senior choral students.

*Extra-curricular choral activities: MSVMA Honors Choir, MSVMA Solo and Ensemble, The Musical, Variety Show (if part of a vocal act), Cabaret, SWMVF Honors Choir, Attend Booster Meetings

SPECIAL OPPORTUNITIES

HONORS CHOIR – The Michigan School Vocal Music Association has established an honors choir program that, at the high school level, features SSAA, TTBB, and SATB Choirs every year. In addition, a High School All-State Choir will be presented at the Michigan Youth Arts Festival in May. Membership into all honors choirs is open by audition to students from schools holding a current MSVMA membership. Those auditioning must be members in good standing in their school's vocal music program. Students interested in auditioning should talk to Ms. Rohwer by September 22nd.

When you audition, you sing the assigned pieces memorized, a cappella and sight-sing a short exercise in front of one adjudicator. Students are assigned a point score in the categories of tone, memorization, intonation, phrasing, diction and vocal technique. The top scoring students are selected for honors choir. There are three honor choirs that happen throughout the year and you have to audition for all of them sequentially, Regional Honors Choir, State Honors Choir, and All-State Honors Choir. Students are required to pay the entrance fee. The Regional auditions will take place at the end of September via an online audition submission process and does not include sight-reading or require memorization.

MSVMA SOLO AND ENSEMBLE – Students are strongly encouraged to participate in MSVMA Solo and Ensemble. As soloists, students prepare 2 contrasting numbers and perform for an adjudicator. A sight-reading component is added at the State level. Soloists may elect for a rating or for comments only. Students are required to pay the entrance fee and make arrangements to practice outside of class. Ensembles can be formed, but students must be willing to put in extra time to practice outside of class.

LEADERSHIP – Students and parents will have an opportunity to become involved in the leadership of their choir.

Section Leaders: With the consent of the director, each section will appoint a section leader to be in charge of basic attendance, some sectionals, section motivation, and musical and supportive leadership. Section leaders should embody the Lakeshore Choir values and demonstrate advanced musical knowledge.

Choir Managers: The choir managers, along with the section leaders, form a council/board for the program that meets regularly with the director to discuss artistic improvement, social activities, concert PR, and recruitment. The Choir Manager is also responsible for assisting with music distribution and collection for their ensemble. Students may apply to be a choir manager at the beginning of the school year.

VOICE LESSONS – Students are encouraged to continue their music development outside of class. Private voice lessons are the best way to improve a student's vocal skill and confidence. Please see Ms. Rohwer for more information on voice teachers and private lessons.

CHOIR PARENT ORGANIZATION

The Lakeshore Choir program needs YOUR help! The success of Lakeshore Choirs is highly augmented by the support of the Lakeshore Choir members' parents and guardians. Parent involvement is an essential part of the success of the Lakeshore Choirs, and every helping hand allows your student to have a better choir experience. Plus, it's FUN for YOU! The Choir Parent Organization helps with fundraisers, trips and tours, special performances, and other events. Having a student enrolled in the Lakeshore Choirs automatically makes you a part of the Lakeshore Choir Parent Organization. Please join us this year for our meetings to find out more!

CHOIR PARENT ORGANIZATION MEETINGS - Meetings will take place in the High School Choir Room at 7 pm. Please see the choir website for dates. You are welcome to attend at any time throughout the year!

FUNDRAISING AND STUDENT ACCOUNTS – Every choir will participate in fundraisers throughout the year. Some of the money will go to the Choir's General Fund or Booster Account for supplies, travel/party expenses, guest artists, scholarships, etc. Some money will go directly into individual student accounts. These accounts allow students to let their fundraising money work directly for them. Students can choose to use the money for registration fees, accompanist fees, t-shirts, trips, medals, etc.
